OPENING CEREMONY

Barry Huntington conducted the opening ceremony.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Tim Smith moved, seconded by Eric Houston to adopt the agenda as outlined. The motion passed with all in favor.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Eric Houston moved, seconded by Tim Smith to approve the minutes as corrected. The motion passed with all in favor.

<u>UP COMING MEETINGS</u> Allen K. Henrie reported that City League meetings will begin tomorrow. There is a CIB workshop in Cedar City on September 17th and a baseball committee meeting set for September 24th.

BUSINESS LICENSE

SWIMMING POOL / WRESTLING ROOM Tim Smith reported on the swimming pool committee meeting. There were two bids received by engineers regarding replacement of the roof. The school district would like to replace the gym roof at the same time as the swimming pool roof. To resurface the pool roof portion it will cost \$26,000.00, and to resurface the gym portion it will cost \$27,000.00. The school district is planning to take care of the smaller projects at the pool as well.

The school district asked if the city would continue trading rent at the BIC building for the next three years as our contribution to the roofing project. This room is used as the wrestling room.

It was rumored that teachers would be losing their jobs if the roof projects are done. This is not true. The funding for building maintenance comes out of a different budget than the teachers salary. The district has funding in their capitol improvement budget for repairs to buildings.

However, Nick Reynolds reported the district may not have the funding to make payroll past 12/2009. They are researching to see if it is possible to transfer funds from the capitol improvement budget to payroll to pay the employees who preform maintenance on the buildings.

Eric Houston moved, seconded by Nick Reynolds to trade rent at the BIC building over the next three years as the city's contribution towards resurfacing the swimming pool roof. The motion passed with all in favor.

CITIZEN COMMENT Becky Yard reported there were a lot of people on main street for the yard sale hosted by Main Street.

<u>MULTI PURPOSE EVENT CENTER</u> The three day Little Britches Rodeo held over the Labor Day weekend went good and was well attended. This upcoming weekend is the barrel races and the following weekend is the Pow Wow.

The 4-H Ranch Rodeo will be held in October. They will honor cowboys and have cowboy poetry.

Kevin and Deanna Moore have been hired to run the concessions at the arena.

Secondary water - The secondary water will be shut off this weekend. The city's average use was much lower than our allotted amount.

Hospital Foundation Dinner - The fund raising dinner is coming up. This will go on the next city council agenda.

CURRENT BILLS The council reviewed the current bills to be paid.

Nick Reynolds moved, seconded by Tim Smith to pay the current bills. The motion passed with all in favor.
