Another year has nearly come and gone. It seems like only yesterday that we were doing a spring newsletter. This has been an unusual year with lots happening on a local, state, national and world stage. The economy and our new president continue to grab the headlines on the big stage, and at the state level, it has been the economy and a new governor grabbing most of the news. Locally, the economy is having a negative effect. However, we are surviving better than most. As I have talked to local businesses, it varies from being a good year to being off by as much as 40% from a year ago.

The weather is always an interesting subject and 2009 is no exception. A wet cool June was a welcome relief, and we did not have our normal heavy frost. The summer, however, was hot and dry, and we never did get our normal rainstorms in July and August. We need lots of winter moisture if we are to have water for next year's crops. Overall crops and gardens did very well in 2009, and we even have some 3<sup>rd</sup> crop hay being harvested. As I type this newsletter it is beautiful outside, but they are predicting a cold front moving in within a few days. So get some firewood gathered, a deer hanging in the garage, and the potatoes dug as we settle in for a long Panguitch winter. Following are a few Panguitch activities and information items.

### Elections

Panguitch recently had a primary election where 4 candidates for mayor were narrowed to 2 candidates. Art Cooper and Janet Oldham will run against each other for Mayor. Tim Smith, Nick Reynolds and Rick Miller are running for the 2 available city council seats. The general election will be held on **November 3<sup>rd</sup>** at the city office at 25 South 200 East. Please come out and vote. Utah Election Laws now require every voter to provide valid identification before being allowed to vote, so please remember to bring identification. We only had 25% turnout for the primary election. Let's do better for the general election.

#### Swimming Pool.

A committee has been organized to work on Pool issues and help with the use of the pool. Brandon and Sandie Smith are doing an excellent job at the pool and use of the pool has increased significantly. The city and the school are working together to make some minor improvements to the pool. The pool can be an important asset to our community. Please support it in any way possible.

#### Water-Culinary-Secondary

Thank you to each of you for your help in getting through a long hot summer. Our secondary water held up well, even though we continued to have some problems during the hottest part of the summer. Culinary water also held up even though we needed to run the well much of the summer.

As the cold weather sets in, please disconnect hoses from the house and blow out your sprinkler systems. It will save you money and time later on. Please open secondary lines so they will drain properly.

#### Budget

Panguitch was able to hold the line on our budget for the 2009/2010 year. We are trying to do our part to keep costs in line. The city has 3 main budgets: the general fund, the water budget, and the sewer budget. The water and sewer budgets are paid from your water and sewer payments on a monthly basis.

The general fund pays for all other expenses in the city. Income for the general fund comes from sales tax, resort tax, class c road tax, and a few misc. other income sources. Sales tax is down about 10 % so far this year, so the economy is having a negative impact on the city. A vast majority of the city expenses are fixed, but we will continue to cut where necessary to keep our budget in line.

#### **Events**

Panguitch had another successful year of major events. Thank You-Thank You to all who volunteered and helped to make these events successful in our community. We still have a few events planned for fall and winter. Come out and support them. We continue to need volunteers and participants to become involved with our events. Remember, the City, County, and Panguitch Utah Stake will again host the annual New Year's Eve Party at the Triple C Arena on Thursday, December 31. Please plan to come and have great fun.

#### Census

Since 1790, the US Constitution has required a national census once every 10 years to count our population. Census data are used to distribute Congressional seats to states, to make decisions about what community services to provide, and to distribute over \$400 billion in federal funds to local, state and tribal governments each year.

The Census will be a count of everyone residing in the United States on April 1, 2010 (all citizens and non-citizens alike). You will receive your questionnaire in March 2010 either by US mail or hand delivery. Households complete this simple 10 question form by listing all people who live in the home as their "usual residence", where they live and sleep most of the time. Federal law protects all your personal information you share during the census for 72 years.

#### Library

We have completed another successful Summer Reading Program with 145 children participating. They completed a total of 792 hours of reading. Eight fun story time programs were presented with an average attendance of 38. A big thank you to all who helped with the Summer Reading and Story Time programs. We are involved in preparing for a new circulation and catalog program. We have put a new barcode on all materials and are preparing to build a new patron database. This program should be completed sometime this winter.

# Landfill

Remember you can be ticketed for dumping garbage on the ground at the green garbage can site. We need to all work together to keep that site as clean as possible.

# **Natural Gas**

After many years of paying a surcharge of \$30.00/month for an extension charge on natural gas, it was eliminated as of Sept 1, 2009. This is approximately 3 years earlier than originally projected. There have been many people working behind the scenes to get this surcharge eliminated, and even though it took a while, it is now gone, and we pay the same price for natural gas as everyone else in the state of Utah. Thank you to those who have testified in hearings, written letters and been involved in this issue.
